2. Golf Centre Development

He said the group had identified 2 possible locations, and the pros and cons of the various options possible in these locations would be presented to a subsequent meeting of the Major Projects Sub-Committee.

4. Any Other Competent Business

Carnoustie Story

J Gilbert said he had listened to a radio programme with regard to North Berwick and the immigration of golfers to the USA from the town. While North Berwick had sent many golfers to the USA, Carnoustie had sent many more and he felt that this was a story that should be explored and recorded in more detail than had been done up to now. The sub-committee agreed and suggested that Donald Ford be contacted with regards to the possible production of a book.
