# 3. <u>Decision Papers</u>

#### 3.1 Tournament Pricing 2022

The Tournament Convenor introduced the Tournament Pricing paper and each open tournament entry fee for 2022 was reviewed.

A Trustee asked for a discussion on the increase of the seniors open event to be in line with a local course. Agreement was made to keep pricing the same based on the green fee rates of the Burnside Course vs other local course.

The sub- committee agreed on the proposed pricing within the decision and agreed to recommend to the full board for approval.

#### 4. Tournament Recap 2021

The Head Professional led the discussion of the tournament recap for the year and highlighted the successful changes to Season Ticket Holders competitions and how the new World Handicap System supported these changes. He also highlighted how it aligns with the CGL core value of inclusivity.

The Chief Executive spoke about the first successful 10-Hole Championship and suggested how the prize could grow year on year making it a larger event. This could possibly be done through our sponsorship partners for the event, John Deere.

The Head Professional asked the committee if there was any further points or feedback they had heard from their respective clubs or other Season Ticket Holders regarding tournaments in 2021. It was agreed that all feedback had been positive.

# **Craws Nest Tassie**

The Head Professional explained that due to an unforeseen server problem with tournament provider GolfBox, The Tassie entry was delayed until Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November. Potential competitors were informed and there was minimal negative feedback via social media and email.

#### European Tour Challenge

The Chief Executive discussed the opportunity of CGL hosting a European Tour Challenge tour event in 2023 that would be hosted and supported by Paul Lawrie. The committee discussed that the proposition would have to be end of season event due to nature of Championship Course bookings throughout the Summer season. The Chief Executive asked this point to be left with Tournament Committee to provide recommendations for the next scheduled meeting.
